June 30, 2022.



Letter of Agreement between the

Buchanan -5C Education Association, MEA/NEA and the Buchanan Community Schools Board of Education

COVID-19 Leave

This Letter of Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into between the Buchanan Community Schools (the "District") Board of Education (the "Board") and the Buchanan -5C Education Association, MEA/NEA (the "Association") as set forth below.

 Rationale. The COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on District operations. To provide for the safety and welfare of the District's students and employees, the Board has authorized the implementation of leave as described below to encourage eligible employees to not work in person under the identified circumstances. For purposes of this Agreement, this leave will be known as "COVID-19 leave".

2. Effective Dates. COVID-19 leave is available only from October 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

3. Application. Up to eight (8) work days of COVID-19 leave is available to a bargaining unit employee who provides written proof of a positive COVID-19 test result from the health department or a qualified healthcare provider. Results from COVID-19 home tests may be accepted with administration approval. Up to eight (8) work days of COVID-19 leave is available to a bargaining unit employee who has not taken a COVID-19 test, but who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms and is directed to isolate as a "probable" COVID-19 case. These eight (8) leave days are cumulative. During the COVID-19 leave, the employee shall receive their normal wages and benefits for their regular work schedule for up to a total of eight (8) work days for the 2021-2022 school year without deduction from the employee's accumulated sick leave. The District reserves the right to request medical documentation of the employee's inability to work.

4. Return to Work. If the employee can return to work wearing a mask, using other mitigation measures, or regular testing pursuant to then-applicable Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Guidance, the employee shall return to work and will not be eligible for continued COVID-19 leave.

 No Grievance. Any District decision about an employee's eligibility for use of COVID-19 leave under this Agreement is not subject to the grievance process in the parties' collective bargaining agreement.

6. **Conformity to Collective Bargaining Agreement.** The terms of this Agreement have been developed through the collective bargaining process between the Board and the Association. Accordingly, the Board and the Association acknowledge and agree that nothing in this Agreement will be regarded as inconsistent with or contrary to the terms of their current collective bargaining agreement or any successor contract. To the extent that there is a conflict or inconsistency between the terms of the Agreement and the parties' collective bargaining agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall control.

7. Conformity to Law. If any provision or application of this Agreement is determined to be invalid or contrary to law by a court or administrative District, such provision shall be severed (to the extent required by law) but the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected unless the severance results in a material change in the benefits or rights of any party under this Agreement. In the latter event, the party claiming to be adversely affected shall give prompt written notice to the other party and shall confer with that party regarding an appropriate resolution of the matter.

 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Michigan.

 Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and supersedes any prior or concurrent agreements, written or oral, regarding its subject matter.

10. **Non-Precedential.** The creation and implementation of this Agreement shall not be precedent-setting and shall not in any way bind the Board or Association (or their respective successors) to continue or perpetuate its conditions beyond its expiration date. The parties expressly acknowledge that this Agreement is not and will not become part of the collective bargaining agreement between the Board and the Association.

11. Expiration. This Agreement expires on June 30, 2022.
